We also wish to remind people of the importance of getting our hands in soil. To enjoy both the physical and mental wellbeing which comes from being in nature, and the simple joy, yet essential life skill, of growing food. As the outdoor 'classroom' wind can be a dangerous element due to potential falling branches, our Weather Policy states: 'if strong winds (measuring over 5 on the Beaufort scale or above 30-38kph) or thunder and lightening, are present session will not take place in the woodland and play in the forest will be prohibited.
